The pain I experienced came on so suddenly I was certain my appendix had burst. As a result of the illness, I lost 42 pounds, and needed nine pills a day, as well as infusions to regain my health and strength.

Today I am the mother of two wonderful children, with a third on the way this May. Being a mother has made me realize how important it is for me to stay healthy, so I can care for my children. My biggest fears are that my children will be diagnosed with IBD, or that I will become too sick to care for them. Having children has intensified my urgency to help find a cure. As Honorary Chair for the 2008 Heel 'n' Wheel-a-Thon, I hope to play an important part in the CCFC's mission to find a cure and inspire others to help find a cure as well.
